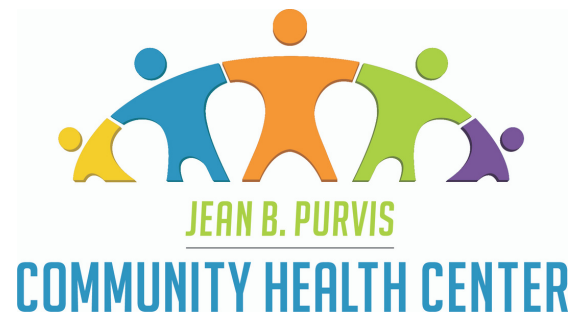

## SUSAN'S STORY

Susan is in her late 50's and is married to a disabled Veteran. She works part time. Susan was struggling with some anxiety when she came to the Center. We had been encouraging Susan to have a mammogram since she became our patient. Then, she found a lump. We worked with Adagio to arrange a diagnostic mammogram. Unfortunately, after additional testing, it was found that Susan had breast cancer. We helped Susan to complete a patient financial assistance application for Butler Health System and apply for Medical Assistance.

In the midst of this, her husband was in a car accident. He suffered whip lash, his motorized scooter was damaged and they received a notice of cancellation of their homeowner's insurance with a list of needed repairs. We worked with the Center for Community Resources, the United Way, the Redevelopment Authority, Helping Butler County and other community resources to provide the help that they needed.

Susan had her surgery late this summer. She is back to work and taking care of her family.

Often the system is scary and it can be overwhelming even to the professionals. The Community Health Center helps those who have limited or no health insurance, many of whom are struggling to work and live.



# LETTER FROM OUR DIRECTOR OF OPERATIONS

While this past year was one of challenge, and sometimes filled with loss that we could not reconcile, it has also been one of opportunity. We had to tell our Volunteers that they could not come to the Center to work. We knew that this was the right thing to do, but it was met with sadness – our family would be separated. We learned two things: 1) Our staff is resilient and committed, willing to wear many hats to serve our patients; and 2) Our Volunteers love to serve. Although our Volunteers could not be physically present, they often sent notes or called with sentiments of encouragement and love. This was the fuel that we needed to keep going!

In the beginning of 2020, no one knew what was unraveling. For many of us, we had never experienced a pandemic let alone truly understood what that meant. Our patients and the uninsured community were scared. We found that the only way to get tested was to have a referral from a PCP – for the uninsured, this is next to impossible. We filled this gap!

Dental was shut down for almost 3 months by the state. This was heartbreaking to our team, as we received call after call from people in pain...people that needed help with no available solutions. When we were able to reopen, the team, our staff and volunteer dentists pulled together to provide care to our patients.

We went virtual in Medical, Behavioral Health and Health & Wellness education. This was a learning experience for all of us. Through Volunteers in Medicine (VIM), we were given the opportunity to use the platform DOXY.ME at no charge. This allowed us to safely and securely continue patient visits, serving their needs and monitoring their health. Each day brought new challenges and rules. Without complaint, our team did what needed to be done to serve our patients. Together, we served over 1,200 patients.

We're looking forward to 2021 and beyond, but we can't ignore what we learned in 2020. In the wake of this roller coaster, our team persevered! It is our passion! We are committed to service – creating strength and stability in the lives of our patients, their families, their work places and our community.

# RACHAEL'S STORY

Rachael Wittmer, a Penn State University student, completed an internship at the Community Health Center. Rachael organized a fundraiser on behalf of the Center. Here is her story:



*In 2018, I ran the Pittsburgh Marathon, hoping to achieve my dream of qualifying for the Boston Marathon. I missed the cut-off by 90 seconds that year.*

*In 2019, I ran the Pittsburgh marathon to re-qualify for the Boston Marathon and made the cut to run Boston in 2020!*

*Due to COVID-19, the Boston Marathon 2020 wasn't held on April 20, 2020.*

*As someone who studies immunology and infectious diseases, I have come to realize that there's more to COVID-19 than just the symptoms and mortality rate. COVID-19 has incited fear and uncertainty for people across the globe, not just for the demographics that are most affected medically. The economic repercussions will impact those who are paid hourly and those without the benefit of sick leave.*

*So, I've decided to make my own "Not-Boston Marathon" and I ran 26.2 miles on April 20, 2020. I wanted this to mean something more than just a race.*

*I ran to raise money for the Jean B. Purvis Community Health Center which is a free medical clinic that provides services for people who fall below the poverty line/are uninsured or underinsured in my hometown. This clinic is almost fully operated on a volunteer basis along with community donations. With many people unable to work due to COVID-19, individuals who rely on this clinic may feel the strain more than most.*

*I can't change the course of a global pandemic, but I can control my reaction to it. In times like this, the silver lining is important.*

*If you're still reading this, thank you. Any donations or words of encouragement to the CHC are appreciated.*

Rachael raised over \$3,600 to support the Community Health Center with her marathon. Rachael will graduate this year with a degree in Immunology and Infectious Diseases. We appreciate Rachael's spirit and commitment to our community. The Center is grateful for Rachael's support and we wish her well in her future endeavors.

# JACK'S STORY

Jack is 59 years old. He called the Center while in a parking lot, crying and thinking about ending his life. Jack had lost his job, lost his health insurance, had no family and was living in his car. Jack had been without his mental health medications for over 6 months. We worked with our local crisis team to get Jack into interim housing for up to 30 days. During this time, we got Jack back on his mental health medications, helped him to apply for Medical Assistance and to find a job. It was not long before Jack was feeling better.

We connected Jack to local agencies for help with clothing, personal hygiene items and even gas for his car. Since there is no free parking in Butler, we worked with a local funeral home so Jack could park his car in their lot while he stayed at the shelter. We found that Jack's driver's license was expired and his birth certificate was destroyed years ago in a fire. We worked with the Center for Community Resources to get Jack his needed identification. As Jack became more stable, we connected him with Catholic Charities to apply for rental assistance. Jack is now working, has his own apartment, has Medical Assistance and has transitioned to a paid medical provider. Today, Jack is thriving in our community.

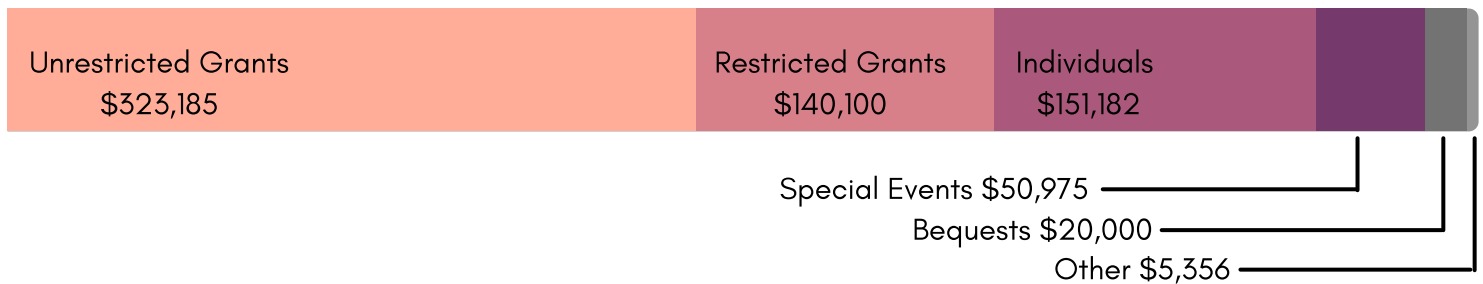

Jean Purvis dedicated her life to helping those less fortunate. In 2005, Jean was inspired by the Volunteers in Medicine model of providing free medical care for adults without health insurance or access to health care. She urged Butler Community leaders to establish the Community Health Clinic of Butler County, which opened in 2008. In 2018, the clinic celebrated 10 years of service, renaming the clinic, the Jean B. Purvis Community Health Center to honor its founder.

Jean received many awards for her community service, including, most recently, the Senator John Heinz Award, from the United Way's Tocqueville Society, and the Women's Leadership Council Award, from the United Way of Southwestern PA.

In November 2019, Michaela Reamer (Kim's daughter) had the privilege of interviewing Jean for a school project. She titled the piece, "The Humble Influencer". While Michaela learned quite a bit about Jean's history, the prominent themes throughout the article were humility and respect. Throughout Jean's life, she was a leader; although she didn't like the spotlight or need a title, she led. Jean found herself in many roles in life and understood that if you treat all people with dignity and respect, much can be accomplished together.

On May 31, 2020, Jean Purvis passed away. Jean instilled these values in life and in the clinic that she created: "Healing begins when patients are treated with dignity and respect". As we move forward, we can each honor Jean by caring for each other, no matter our differences, treating all with dignity and respect. Jean was loved and is missed by all who knew her.

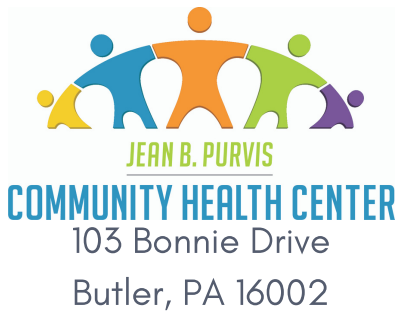
