

TIME FLIES WHEN YOU'RE HAVING FUN!

We use the term "time flies when you're having fun" to express that time appears to go by more quickly when we enjoy ourselves. That term describes my time at the Jean B. Purvis Community Health Center.

Seventeen years ago, Jean Purvis called me and asked if I would volunteer to help raise money to start a free clinic in Butler. With the help of people like Jean, we were successful in raising more than \$1 million to open the Clinic. In 2015, Jean again called me and asked me to join the Board of Directors of the Clinic. I explained that I wouldn't have time to serve on the board, to which she responded, "We meet in the morning." I agreed to serve on the board. Later in 2015, Executive Director Kim Reamer asked me if I would join the staff as the Director of Development. I explained to Kim that I was attempting to retire but I would give it some thought. In January of 2016, I became the first Director of Development for the Clinic and, thanks to the generous support from people like you, we were able to successfully build a fundraising program that continues to keep the Clinic strong. I finally retired at the end of 2023 at the age of 75. The Clinic has hired Kim Lunn as the new Director of Development. Kim has considerable experience and success in healthcare fundraising and will do an excellent job for the Clinic. I ask all of you to continue to support the Clinic as you have done in the past and be supportive of Kim and her fundraising efforts.

I have had the fortune of working with one of the most committed staff I have ever worked with. Kim Reamer is exceptional and has done a wonderful job in bringing the Clinic to a new level. A special thank you to the incredible staff for helping with fundraising events to raise money for the clinic. Butler is truly blessed to have such a group of caring people who are willing to work to serve those in need in our community. I will miss my day-to-day contact with all those special people, as well as the many volunteers I have come to know. I will continue to serve on the Board of Directors and occasionally drop by to have lunch with my friends. PATIENT SUCCESS

Bob is a 53-year-old man who had concerns over his weight and has not been to the doctor in years. He made an appointment at the CHC due to having no energy, blurred vision, and pain all over his body. The clinic's CRNP discovered his AlC was 12.4 and started him on oral diabetic medications and long-acting insulin. Bob met with the clinic's diabetes educator and was given a glucometer, test strips, and other supplies, as well as a Freestyle Libre 2 continuous glucose monitor. He was taught to use all of the equipment, and regular check-in appointments were scheduled. Bob attended some of the CHC's patient education classes, including a carb counting class and a weight loss/healthy eating class, where he learned to make critical changes to his diet. Bob was prescribed new glasses by the clinic's ophthalmologist, and the dental team filled a cavity and provided oral hygiene education.

In six months, Bob lost 40 pounds, lowered his A1C to 5.6, and was able to stop taking insulin. Bob also landed a new job which allowed him to transition to private health insurance. He walks three to four miles each day and says he hasn't felt this healthy in years!

SERVICES

MEDICAL

Outpatient primary medical care, preventive medical services, treatment of acute and chronic illnesses, referrals for specialized services, referrals to other agencies when appropriate, select immunizations, and free medications when possible.

CHC Drug Room distributed over \$161,523.39 in medications in 2023

DENTAL

Quality basic dentistry including preventative, restorative dental care, and oral education at no cost. The CHC cares for patients who have no dental insurance or have limited dental coverage. Services are provided to individuals aged 19 to 64 and veterans of any age.

In 2023, 7 dentisits gave their time and served 712 patients.

BEHAVIORAL HEALTH The Center provides treatment related to anxiety and depression. Physicians work with patients to develop a treatment plan and medication is prescribed and monitored as warranted and needed. The Center has continued its partnership with a Licensed Professional Counselor to provide short-term counseling.

Behavioral Health services were provided to 129 patients in 2023

VISION

Comprehensive eye exams and glasses (as prescribed) are provided. Regular eye exams help to reduce the chance of blindness and vision loss while staying on top of developing eye diseases such as cataracts and glaucoma.

In 2023, 61 patients were provided with free eyeglasses.

DERMATOLOGY

Provided by UPMC Mobile Dermatology to improve access to dermatology, to protect the largest organ in the human body. Dr. Alaina James, Pitt University medical students, and UPMC continue their partnership with the Community Health Center.

Dermatology services were provided to 16 CHC patients in 2023


HEALTH & WELLNESS





DENTAL



The CHC's dental program has been providing quality basic and restorative dental care to the uninsured and underinsured residents of Butler County and surrounding communities since 2010. The dental program is the CHC's fastest growing program. About one-third of the CHC's dental patients are military veterans who do not qualify for dental care through the VA. Last year, the CHC received an anonymous grant that allowed it to build and furnish a third dental operatory. This operatory has been incredibly beneficial in allowing the CHC's dental professionals to treat patients more efficiently, because it maximizes staff productivity. Adding the operatory has also allowed the dental clinic to accommodate more emergency appointments, as well as offer non-emergency appointments in a more timely manner.
