When you come in to the office, there is a new **staff/volunteer check-in** station. The station is located at the end of the front desk. At this station, you will enter your name, the time you arrived and your temperature. You will answer the following questions:

- In the last 48 hours, have you experienced fever, shortness of breath, dry cough, runny nose, sore throat, loss of taste/smell, any other flu-like symptoms?
- Feeling unwell?
- Been in contact with anyone that has tested positive for COVID-19?
- Traveled outside of the Commonwealth?

Also, as part of our new procedures, all **patients** are called 48 hours prior to their appt. to answer a list of similar questions. Temperatures are taken upon arrival and the same questions are asked again.

Please note: if you are not feeling well, please stay home. If you have any questions or if we can be of any help to you, please let us know. Be well!

Before he died, Congressman John Lewis penned a letter to the nation, offering some final words: "While my time here has now come to an end, I want you to know that in the last days and hours of my life you inspired me," "Though I may not be here with you, I urge you to answer the highest calling of your heart and stand up for what you truly believe. In my life I have done all I can to demonstrate that the way of peace, the way of love and nonviolence is the more excellent way. Now it is your turn to let freedom ring."

You can read his final letter, published in [The New York Times](#) on July 30, the day of his funeral.

Congressman John Lewis served was an American politician and a Civil Rights Leader. He served in the United States House of Representatives since 1987. Rest in peace John Robert Lewis. (February 21, 1940 – July 17, 2020)
